What is dyslexia?

What are some common characteristics of dyslexia and language-based learning differences? How does it feel to experience dyslexia and its attendant processing challenges? What can classroom teachers or parents do to recognize and support dyslexic students? This course, geared toward all K-12 educators, will cover multiple topics including: dyslexia, facts vs. myths, characteristics of dyslexia and related language-based learning differences, what teachers need to know, classroom accommodations and remediation strategies, multi-sensory lesson demonstration, and helping students understand their brains and identify their strengths.

This course is designed to provide educators with 20 contact hours (15 hours classroom time and 5 hours outside class time), leading to 20 recertification points.
